Courses accepted in transfer which satisfy USM Core Curriculum requirements are indicated by a letter following the course number, as shown below.

C	English Composition	3 credits

F	Fine Arts - Performance *	3 credits
G	Fine Arts - History *	3 credits
H	Humanities - Literature **	3 credits
I	Humanities - Other Times/Other Cultures **	3 credits
J	Social Science ***	6 credits
K	Natural Sciences (with laboratory)	3 or 4 credits
W	Writing-intensive ****	3 credits

* Fine Arts courses must be selected from different departments.

** Humanities courses must have different course prefixes.

*** Social Science courses must be selected from different departments.

**** Transfer students may satisfy this requirement by completing a course where the transfer institution has an established category of writing-intensive courses and the course completed is designated as such *or* by completing a two-semester sequence in English Composition.
