Partner Policy

OLLI will seek to establish an informal (i.e. not legally binding) partnership with other community nonprofit organizations when both parties mutually benefit from the partnership.

Partnering Procedure

OLLI's Executive Director will be responsible for overseeing and making contacts with potential partners. The Executive Director will submit partner recommendations to the Executive Committee for their review. The Executive Committee will then submit partner recommendations to OLLI's Council for its approval.

Mutual benefits could include:

Benefits Partner's Could Provide to OLLI:

- Use of facility or classrooms to hold OLLI courses or other OLLI functions.
- Provide funding or other "in-kind" support (i.e. grants or direct monetary donation, sponsorship of special event or paid advertisements, donation of used office furniture, office or instructional equipment).
- Publicize OLLI via newsletter, bulletin boards, news stand, website or other publications.
- Provide instructors to teach for OLLI.
- Refer clients to OLLI when appropriate.
- Offer volunteer opportunities for OLLI members.

Benefits OLLI Could Provide to Partners:

- Promote partner's programs or activities in newsletters, on OLLI's website and news stand, and via OLLI's membership email list.
- Provide visibility of partner's services by having representatives of the partner teach an OLLI course.
- Refer OLLI members to the partnering organization when appropriate.
- Offer volunteer opportunities for members of the organization.
