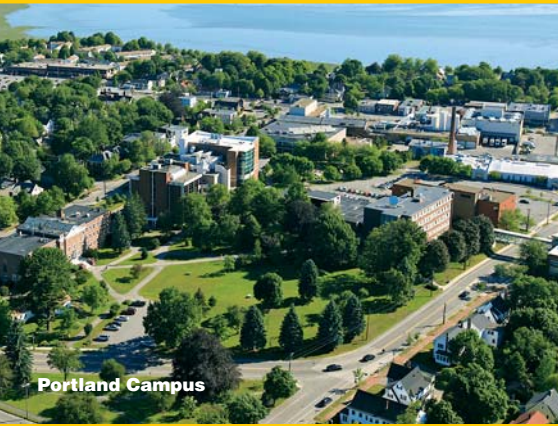

USM Snapshot

- USM offers its 9,600 students more than 115 areas of undergraduate and graduate study on our Portland, Gorham, and Lewiston-Auburn Campuses. USM's location in southern Maine, a region cited as one of the most livable in the country, offers a range of educational, cultural, and recreational opportunities.
- Member of the University of Maine System
- 40 states and 18 foreign countries are represented in the student body.
- National and international study away opportunities.
- Student-faculty ratio—15:1
- Average class size—25
- Enrollment of 9,564 including 7,561 undergraduates and 2,093 graduate/law students.
- Nationally recognized Honors program and the Russell Scholars program offer unique learning opportunities.
- USM has 30,857 active alumni in all 50 states and numerous foreign countries.
- 100-plus student organizations on campus.
- Located in Portland, Maine, which was named America's Most Livable City by *Forbes* in 2009.
- Recognized for several years running, including in 2011, as one of the "Best in the Northeast" by *The Princeton Review*.



Residential Life

- The seven residence halls in Gorham offer students a traditional small college living environment with many different Special Interest Housing options, such as First Year Integration, International, Outdoor Adventure, and the Community of Arts.
- All residence hall rooms are equipped with high-speed Internet access, cable television access, telephone jacks, and a microfridge unit (combined refrigerator/freezer/microwave).

Tuition:

- Maine residents: \$7,590
- Out-of-state residents: \$19,950
- New England Regional Program Canadian Residents: \$11,400

Room and Board: \$9,287

Rates for room and board vary depending upon the room and meal plan selected.

Fees: \$1,310

Financial Aid

- Approximately 80% of students receive financial aid in the form of scholarships, grants, work-study, and educational loans.
- USM merit scholarship consideration deadline is February 1.

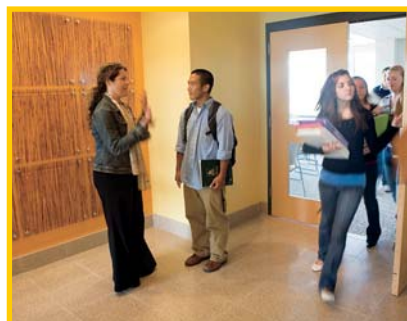
